5.6 Executive Reports

5.6.1 Academic & University Affairs Commissioner – Meghan Wing



- Main update: O-week was super successful and we received great feedback from students via social media.
- Currently doing work with Student Accessibility Services looking into Open Education resources, since
 textbooks are really expensive. There is a meeting this Friday to come up with a game plan, like having
 a timeline and starting off with the beginning stages
- Rebecca and I feel that the whole board should have a focus group/workshop where we can have open discussions

5.6.2 Communications & Corporate Affairs Commissioner – Zoey Ross

- O-week: We had the strongest social media this week increased followers on Twitter and increased likes on our Facebook page
 - If you liked the Facebook page at the block party, you got a free neon wristband deemed to be an effective method
 - We also had a good flow at our first CSA photo booth at the block party
- I admit that mistakes were made during O-week, but I had good support and we were all there for each
 other to help us out. Not one event wasn't popular. The Corn Roast had a very long line Wolfgang
 was with me on the BBQ and it was a cool moment for me.
- There was such a big margin of difference between both acts, but we listened to the students and chose the band and artist they wanted. We didn't send as many tickets as we would've liked but we promo'd Alessia Cara all over campus. Alessia is doing well: she just finished a tour with Coldplay and was on Ellen recently, so we're still not sure why there wasn't as great of a turnout. Still, it was a wonderful experience, but we want to understand how we can attract more people for next time.
- We haven't had that conversation about accessibility for mobile apps yet, but it is arguably just as important... We should have one of the most successful apps on campus by the time we're done
- Nestle was under scrutiny for pumping water out of Guelph. Made a short concise letter regarding the subject and it was printed by the Montreal Gazette, and it was picked up on an interview for CBC –they asked a question and they printed out the answer we sent.
- Pep-Rally: Met Mayor Guthrie there and put up the flag together, mended the bridges we had with the city. Shows the work we can do.

Discussion:

- OAC: I have a question around communication with the website. How can students go to us if they're having issues? Why is our website tied with the university? We should be separate from them.
- C&CA: Our website expired on August 25th and it no longer exists. We would have to go to an independent, which will cost us a lot of money. I believe me and Meghan made the right decision.
- A&UA: Peter, that is a good point. But we exist because UofG exists. We advocate for students. We
 want to keep our URL and logo because it's bulletproof. That's what I was fighting for. It was a really low
 cost to us and due to financial decisions last year, we do need to keep money in mind this year. This is
 why we stuck to this template; the fact that we have an accessible website is more important to me than
 having red and gold on our page.

5.6.3 Finance and Operations Commissioner -- Ryan Shoot

• O-week was amazing. Our block party had over 2,000 people; over 700 students for Dog Days. I want to thank our staff whom went above and beyond - especially Dave, our backbone.

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- We want a program where students can go for their mental health. Once or twice a month, we'll be talking about the program. By Winter semester we'll discuss what did and didn't work about it.
- 2 stellar documents regarding the University Centre: 1, whether the UC should be run by a Board or not and 2, regarding a guide and principles of the building – what each floor does and what they can do for the students.
- Student employment: Visit csa.ca/jobs to apply!
- Bus pass distribution: We had 3 major platforms on a grid board and students could put a sticky note on what was important to them and what they want the CSA to improve on. We took a lot of responses from students about what they want us to do with their money. Commented on what they liked about our campaigns and services. There were a total of 20,000 sticky notes.
- Clubs Day this Thursday and Friday support the clubs! Also, volunteer with Meal Exchange
- The late night bus service has begun. We want something visible so people know they are paying for this service. The fact is students have paid for it and they should know this, which is what we're working on.

5.8.2 (Action) Food Bank Referendum

Whereas every semester all full and part time undergraduate students pay \$1.73 per semester (increased annually by the consumer price index) to support the student foodbank on campus, and

Whereas in 2015 alone, the student foodbank provided emergency food and resources to over 540 individuals. To keep up with demand and rising food cost, the foodbank needed to spend an additional \$13,300 on food acquisition last year, and

Whereas the food bank is currently running a deficit despite intensive fundraising efforts and receiving one-time emergency financial assistance, and

Whereas a long term solution is needed which requires the support of the undergraduate population, therefore Students have supported the foodbank since 2004, and we are once again calling on your support to make a difference.

Do you support an increase of \$0.52 (for a total of \$2.25) per semester (Fall, Winter, Spring/Summer) for full time and part time undergraduate students, that is increased annually by the consumer price index for Ontario?

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- The Student Food Bank is currently running a deficit, despite fundraising.
- This referendum will support the Student Food Bank on campus. It will provide emergency food and resources.
- Do you support an increase of 52 cents?
 Moved: A&UA Seconded: Finance
- A&UA: I want to hand speaking rights to Ramitha, the Food Bank Coordinator
- Food Bank Coordinator: I want to put the referendum forward the question is explicit. It would help our food budget line by getting us an extra \$10,000. We are working to get long-term solutions, but this is why the referendum is happening.
- BofG: Where did 52 cents come from?
- Food Bank Coordinator: It's a good number. It's not solving everything, but it's also unfair to ask for more.
- CASU: An update: the CEO admits quite a few of those statements in the referendum are *leading*, which
 isn't how you want to phrase a referendum... The "whereas" statements seem 'clunky'. We want to
 make it more neutral so that the students will view it better.
- Chair: SRC approved this by email?
- CASU: Yes.
- Chair: I don't want to discuss the wordings of the referendum. Anyone is free to challenge me on that.
- OAC: It is my opinion that the CSA, instead of running this in the Fall, should do this in the Winter. We should use our voice to call the administration. It is a safer bet... It is *only* \$10,000.
- A&UA: I would like to speak in favour of this motion primarily because it is under the strong belief of the CSA staff working with the Food Bank that we are capable of getting this referendum in question to pass at UofG.
- Finance: I'm already seeing support from students. They want to support it. Personally, I don't think we have an issue reaching quorum. We have to work together as a team; we need to have faith in our student-run Food Bank... It is not admin-run.
- CASU: It is such a good initiative but there's not enough funding. The food bank did so much with how
 little they have This needs to pass.
- C&CA: We have a strong plan; we need to work together to have a successful election.
- CPES-SC: Holding the referendum question in the Fall wouldn't be a bad thing because we may still
 have the attention of the students; in the Winter semester, they will forget who we are.
- GRCGED: This is an important referendum question, but caution, this will not be a fun referendum because students won't react to it well.

Question is put forward. Motion carried.

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Hello directors,

Hope you had a refreshing break.

We did it. For the first time since 1976 a fall referendum question met quorum. Two new commissioners and a new director have also been selected by the membership.

This election brought to light that we need a stronger and more prescriptive elections policy. I feel like the current range of bylaws and policies that speak to elections are too much to the interpretation of the CEO year over year. There are many conventions that exist within CSA elections but these processes have not been properly recorded and put into a policy anywhere. I feel this is something that should be taken on by PBRC as soon as possible.

I also wanted to take a moment to let you know where I stand on organizational reform:

I feel the CSA is coming to a crossroads. As a member, director and commissioner I feel we need to begin thinking critically if our current organizational structure is serving our membership as best as possible. I'm nearly half way into my term and this idea has been weighing on me quite heavily. Our executive positions are laid out that an executive is an employee not just a political figure or advocate. They are responsible for the oversight of whole departments, human resources, large campaigns, and marketing goals that are worthy of a senior industry professional. I don't think this system is sustainable for our organization. We need professionals that are able to assist our executive team in fulfilling the boards vision. I recognize that this decision, and change if any, is at the boards discretion. For transparency reasons, I am letting you know I stand for organizational reform to a hierarchical structure wherein the role of the executives is mainly to take direction from the board, supervise a GM, and advocate for students. I feel that we need to reach out the members and ask who we are, and that the great work being done by the Academic and University Affairs Commissioner is putting us on that path. What we do for students and how we do it, are two different things. We need to be directed and driven by students then put that direction into effect as efficiently as possible. I feel a new system of governance and organizational structure would be a more efficient solution that would save the CSA time, money and would produce quicker, more accurate results of the student vision.
